



AAAs role in the OHT ICDS proposal

Area Agencies on Aging were successful in getting a role for community long-term services and supports specialists within the Integrated Care Delivery System proposal of the Office of Health Transformation and Ohio Health plans. Key features include:

- AAAs will maintain their role across the state as a front door access point for seniors and those with long term care needs;
- AAA will operate within the ICDS demonstration grant as long term services and supports specialist care managers and;
- AAAs will maintain their case management role in PASSPORT, Choices and assisted living waivers in the counties outside of the ICDS waiver demonstration.
