





WHEREAS, cities and communities have different needs, resources, and varying capacities to engage their resources to take action to facilitate active aging, and the Age Friendly Worthmeton plan will be unique to this community:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Municipality of Worthington, County of Franklin, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the City supports initiatives and opportunities to engage in the Network of Age-Friendly Cities and Communities that encourage and promote public policies supporting healthy aging.

SECTION 2. In order to use AARP as a resource, a staff designee of the City of Worthington is hereby directed to apply to AARP to join the Network of Age-Friendly Communities.

That the City of Worthington shall hereby convene the Age Friendly Worthington Initiative to actively seek input from diverse stakeholders, including older residents, to evaluate current and potential age friendly initiatives, services, and programming in our community and to develop an action plan specific to Worthington.

SECTION 4. That the Clerk of Council be and hereby is instructed to record this Resolution in the appropriate record book.
