Decision Strategies






NORMAL COGINITIVE AGING

Thinking Skills that are Affected by Normal Aging

- Short term memory
- Reasoning
- Speed of processing information



Lack of ability to discharge or understand either healthcare or financial management

CAPACITY

Decision by medical doctor

Person's collective skills, knowledge and behaviors required to deliver a certain outcome







ETHIC OF CARE






Multicultural Ethical Decision-Making Model

Ethical Decision-Making Step	Components of the Process
Identify and define an ethical dilemma	What is the right vs. right issue?
Explore the context of the power	Where am I in the power structure? Where is my client?
Access acculturation and racial identity developments	Where is my client in acculturation?
Seek consultation	Who do I know is culturally competent?
Generate alternative solutions	What are some options? What are the fears and misgivings about the options?
Select a course of action	What role does the client play in decision-making?
Evaluate the decision	How does this fit with the Code of Ethics?



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


	01	Letter of Intent	Personalized statement for allocating property, pets, etc.


